From a small regional school when I arrived, we have become a benchmark school on a Swiss and European scale, and we are the focus of considerable attention under "Entwerfen lehren" Werk,bauen+wohnen,n°11-2023.

The Master's program, which began with 12 students, now has 113.

When I became Head of Architecture in 2010, the department had 151 Bachelor students; today it has 243 and M/W parity has almost been achieved. Architecture is the largest department in terms of number of students and teaching staff.

We have opened a joint Master's degree with the University of Geneva, the Master of Territorial development, to train urban planners. This university course is unique in Switzerland.

We have a teaching and research partnership with the public administration, the Department of Territory of the Canton of Geneva.
